The Haftarah represents the second highest level of holiness in Jewish tradition. Chanted every Shabbat and holidays it has come to represent a specific way to sanctify special moments in people's lives. The Haftarah scroll, like the Torah itself can never be thrown away it must be buried as a holy object.

The FJMC has developed a traditional idea into an opportunity to enrich Jewish identity for emerging adults and existing Jewish adults. Chant from your own Haftarah scroll, handwritten by trained scribes in Israel on parchment, the Haftarah scroll can be inscribed for any occasion.

What makes the FJMC Haftarah scroll so special? It's easy to read. Large size print, which include, vowels and cant illation.

Bring it with you to the synagogue on your Haftarah anniversary; teach it to your family. Make your special life cycle events part of your family legacy and pass it on to future generations.
