### The Shoah Yellow Candle<sup>TM</sup>

The Yellow Candle was created in 1981 to keep the memory of the Six Million alive. It is modeled after a traditional Jewish yahrzeit candle used on the death anniversary of a family member.



The photo on the candle shows a group of young people visiting Auschwitz-Birkenau. This reflects the importance of teaching our youth the lessons of the Holocaust.



The program logo is a yellow Magen David (Star of David) with barbed wire around the word "Jude", reminiscent of the armband patch worn in the ghettos. The candle's yellow wax reminds us of this patch.

### **Candle Delivery Methods**



Candles can be delivered by mail, packed inside white cardboard boxes. The boxes allow insertion of program materials from your organization. Boxes are available in bundles of 48. Many organizations order candles and boxes together.



Local delivery by hand can also be done with a plastic bag which hangs on door handles. Parent/child delivery teams are an opportunity to educate our children about the Shoah. FJMC also direct mails Yellow Candles, using lists which are sent to our organization.


# How Does the Yellow Candle<sup>TM</sup> Program Work?

Candles are ordered in cases of 48. Most groups manage delivery to their own members. Candles can also be obtained individually by sending a list of names and addresses to FJMC.
